From Pastor Desk:

"Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect" (Romans 12:2).

God desires for us to draw near to God with both our hearts and our minds. One of the best ways to do that is to think, pray, and mediate on God's truths each day. There are multiple formats and ways to do this, but this is essentially what daily devotions are all about. On one hand, we could simply read a Bible passage each day and then pray.
