In going back to our old lives, we are accepting worldly values and purposes which lead us to push God to the background. But if we allow the small glimpse of God that we have experienced to lead us to a deeper commitment to Jesus, then we begin to reap the fruit and blessings of having an intimate relationship with the one who loves us more than anything else in this world.

We soon discover that our souls long for accompaniment, intimacy and spiritual friendship."

**Fearfully and Wonderfully: The Marvel of Bearing God's Image** by Dr. Paul Brand & Philip Yancey "God's imaginative genius with his physical creation always has astounding parallels in the spiritual realm, and it's no different with the epitome of his creation, the human body. In Fearfully and Wonderfully, my friend Philip and his coauthor Dr. Brand draw amazing parallels between our bodies and the Body of Christ that leave the reader startled and breathless with wonder..."
